



From Hardships To A National Champion

Yadam^{*} arrived at CNCF's Blue Skies Ger Village at the age of 8, where he found a new home alongside his siblings. Despite growing up in poverty-stricken conditions, Yadam always felt grateful for the presence of his family. On days when they could not afford groceries, Yadam's sister would cook simple dishes with whatever remnants they had, simply enough to create moments of pure joy for Yadam. Unfortunately, Yadam's father, who was the family breadwinner, made a regrettable decision that led to his arrival at a correctional facility.

Upon becoming part of the Ger Village community, Yadam began practising Taekwondo with his siblings, where his love for the sport blossomed. Engaging in Taekwondo became an emotional outlet for Yadam, helping him heal from the childhood hardships he had faced and filling his heart with happiness. Through Taekwondo, Yadam has not only cultivated his martial skills, but also nurtured essential values such as patience, perseverance, and respect for his opponents, peers, and the world around him.

This year, Yadam's dedication and hard work was recognised when he was awarded a Silver medal at the National Taekwondo Championship. Yadam also successfully participated in the South Korea Ambassador Cup 2022 and won a Silver medal. Yadam's journey from a life of abject poverty to becoming a national Taekwondo champion is a testament to the power of hard work, determination, and the unwavering guidance and assistance of CNCF and our community of kind-hearted supporters.

An Inspiring Transformation Through Sports

10-year-old Altanzul* lived with her mother and siblings before arriving at CNCF's Blue Skies Ger Village. Struggling with alcohol addiction, her mother sold the family home and often left Altanzul and her siblings unattended in their small rented room. When the authorities discovered the children's situation, they were immediately transferred to the Ger Village.

Due to her family's circumstances, Altanzul often faced academic challenges and found it difficult to make friends and connect with others. However, our team noticed a significant change when Altanzul began participating in Taekwondo classes as part of CNCF's Blue Skies Sports Programme. Altanzul's passion for the sport not only enabled her to focus on her studies, but also instilled in her great determination, self-confidence, and essential social skills.

Two years on under the care of CNCF's Ger Village, Altanzul's resilience continues to shine, especially in her Taekwondo pursuits. Her dedication and talent were showcased when she won a Gold medal at the Songinokhairkhan District Championship in March this year. CNCF is immensely proud of Altanzul and her personal and professional accomplishments over the years. With her optimism, Altanzul looks forward to continuing her journey in Taekwondo and pursuing her academic studies, knowing that CNCF will continue providing the support and guidance she needs.
