BACKGROUND

The Blue Skies Kindergarten was established to support the educational and emotional development of our preschool children (ages 1 to 6) residing at CNCF's Ger Village and vulnerable children living in the wider community, and to date, remains the only free Kindergarten in the local district providing children with holistic support and the only free of charge Montessori Kindergarten in the whole country. This programme aims to create a safe and happy environment where disadvantaged children can develop socially and emotionally whilst learning basic literacy and numeracy skills for Primary School entry, in addition to cultivating healthy life habits, confidence, self-esteem and the ability to think creatively

MONITORING AND EVALUATION

Regular meetings are held between the CNCF Kindergarten Team and the CNCF Ger Village Management and Psychosocial Teams. Monitoring visits are conducted by CNCF's Director of Operations during programme activities to discuss any challenges and programme developments with the Kindergarten staff. All children meet regularly with CNCF's Doctors for health check-ups. The National Authority conducts government inspections to ensure child safety practices are in place and the National Inspection Agency, as well as health and fire safety inspections by the local district authorities, are also conducted regularly. A monthly report is completed by the programme manager and an annual report is made available to all stakeholders



OUR YEAR

CNCF recognises the critical importance of a comprehensive approach to nurturing every child's intellectual, social, and emotional growth. For children from disadvantaged backgrounds marked by poverty, neglect, and abuse, CNCF's Blue Skies Kindergarten provides a safe haven. Here, they develop physical, personal, social, and emotional well-being, laying a strong and crucial foundation for cognitive development and learning.

Throughout 2023, CNCF's Blue Skies Kindergarten continued its integrated Montessori and national pre-education curriculum. This approach supports holistic child development and community bonding. Children engaged in age-appropriate lessons in science, mathematics, culture, language, emotions, and interpersonal skills through self-directed activities, hands-on learning, and collaborative play.

CNCF's Blue Skies Kindergarten remains the pioneering Montessori welfare kindergarten in Mongolia, the only offering free services to children in extreme poverty. Here, literacy, numeracy, social skills, and emotional development are nurtured, ensuring every child receives a strong educational foundation and support.

Davaa's Transformative Journey at CNCF's Blue Skies Kindergarten

Davaa*, a 5-year-old boy, lives with his mother, grandparents, and siblings in their own small ger (a traditional Mongolian home) in a deprived area in the outskirts of Mongolia's capital city, Ulaanbaatar. Following his father's tragic sudden departure, in desperation his mother sought support from her elderly parents who too lived in challenging circumstances. Fortunately, CNCF heard of the family's struggles and Davaa's older siblings found nurturing and protection at CNCF's Blue Skies Kindergarten, where Davaa enrolled in September 2020 also.

Initially, Davaa faced delayed cognitive and physical development, along with communication challenges due to the poverty-related environment he had been born into and the impact these had on his development. Reluctant to be apart from his mother, he often cried and had frequent absences during his first year at kindergarten. However, by the second year, his attendance improved, and his motor skills normalised, this young boy had started to flourish under the care, support and opportunities the Kindergarten provided.

By 2023, regular attendance and focused Montessori training at Blue Skies Kindergarten transformed Davaa. His behaviour stabilised, motor coordination improved, and he developed a keen interest in self-care and orderliness. Davaa nowenjoys playing with his friends at the Kindergarten, communicates effectively, has enhanced language skills including reading poetry, and demonstrates self-control and cooperative play. He eagerly anticipates starting primary school next year, confident in his abilities to thrive in a new academic environment. We could not be prouder of how far Davaa and his siblings have come thanks to CNCF's Blue Skies Kindergarten, providing them with crucial early years support and the foundations to enable their continued positive and flourishing development.

Inspiring Progress: Baynaa's Journey at the Blue Skies Kindergarten

Baynaa*, a 7-year-old boy, spent his early years at home under the care of his struggling single mother alongside his three siblings. Their home is a small ger (a traditional Mongolian home) on the outskirts of the city.

Baynaa began attending Blue Skies Kindergarten in October 2022. On his first day, he exhibited hyperactivity, difficulty sitting still, language delays, and limited communication skills outside of interactions with his mother. He also showed sensitivity towards unreal concepts, sudden-anger outbursts, and struggled with insomnia. Subsequently diagnosed with autism, Baynaa initially found it challenging to adjust to the Kindergarten's routines and meals, often becoming agitated.

With guidance from his mother who was supported by CNCF, special meals were prepared at home with CNCF's support to ease his transition into the academic year. A tailored developmental training plan was implemented based on assessments of his special needs. Each day, alongside regular kindergarten activities, Baynaa's teacher focused on improving his language skills and teaching basic self-care using methods like the Glenn Doman technique. Montessori lessons in life skills, mathematics, language, and general knowledge were adapted to support his unique requirements.

Over time, and with the right care, love and support, Baynaa grew comfortable with histeacher and the Kindergarten environment. He greeted his teachers and friends each morning with a smile, eagerly engaged in activities, and developed improved communication skills, regularly expressing himself to his teacher. After completing kindergarten, Baynaa successfully transitioned to a mainstream school, where he continue ically

alongside his peers. Baynaa's story is a testament to the tailored care and support provided to each of the children at the Kindergarten, empowering and celebrating their individual, and very special, human spirit.
