BACKGROUND	Established as an offshoot of CNCF's Child Sponsorship Programme, the Education Scholarship Programme provides young people living in abject poverty with the opportunity to pursue tertiary education through the provision of education scholarships to cover the costs of their education. The Programme also encourages the well-rounded development of our students by facilitating a range of community service activities and life skills trainings and workshops, enabling our young people to develop self-awareness, confidence and necessary knowledge and skills to become independent and self-sufficient individuals making a positive contribution to their community

REPORT 2023 OUR YEAR

All children and young people have the right to a guality education and equal opportunities in life, which many students living in poverty-stricken backgrounds are often deprived of. CNCF's Education Scholarship Programme provides a pathway to a sustainable future for these young people by enabling them to remain in school and pursue tertiary education. The Programme enables the students to gain knowledge, have access to life skills trainings and personal development programmes. These opportunities help to prepare and support their future in the employment market and enable them to lift themselves out of the cycle of poverty and create lasting change to the lives of their families and future generations yet to come.

In 2023, CNCF's Education Scholarship Programme (ESP) in Mongolia continued to provide financial support to children and young people, enabling the students to continue their education at High School, College, University, and tertiary Educational Institutes.

Programme Description

Education plays a fundamental role in the growth and development of every child and is a leading factor in enabling children to break their generational cycle of poverty. Very often, the educational costs of tuition fees, transportation, uniforms, learning materials, and informal fees set by schools or communes at the local level remain barriers to learning for many children from impoverished backgrounds. Many children are unable to attend school to complete their education and are at risk of disengagement and, as a result, abuse and exploitation in all its forms. CNCF's Education Scholarship Programme (ESP) in Mongolia protects and provides vulnerable children and young people with the financial support to continue and further their education.

The Education Scholarship Programme was established in 2001 in Mongolia as a branch of CNCF's Child Sponsorship Programme (CSP), providing young people living in abject poverty who wish to further their education in college, university, or vocational training but lack the financial resources to do so. The ESP offers young people the opportunity to pursue tertiary education through education scholarships covering the costs of their education.

To support children in CSP who wish to continue their studies beyond the age of eighteen, we contact their sponsors to ask for continued support in covering the child's tuition fees. If the sponsor is unable to do so, the student can apply to our scholarship fund by meeting with our sponsorship team, outlining their motivations for continuing their education and providing a record of their school grades and reports. The children's living conditions and family income are also considered to assess their eligibility for this Programme. Students are required to submit a short essay outlining their choice of subject, future aspirations, and their commitment to receiving a scholarship.

The Mongolian education system differs from the Western education system. The academic year begins in September and ends around June of the



following year, spanning two years. For instance, 2023-2024:

- Primary school runs from 1st grade to 5th grade.
- Middle school spans 6th grade to 9th grade.
- High school covers 10th grade to 12th grade. High school is for students who successfully completed middle school.
- Vocational training centres and colleges run from the 1st year to the 3rd year. Students receive certificates upon graduation after completing middle school.
- Universities operate from the 1st year to the 4th year (6th year for medical students). Students receive bachelor's diplomas after completing high school, college, vocational training centres.



Scholarship Disbursement

Full or partial scholarships for the upcoming academic year are awarded to eligible children. All students must reapply for funding each year, and our team evaluates their academic progress and commitment. Although not strictly limited to children already under one of our Foundation's Programmes, we do not advertise or promote the scholarship fund externally. Therefore, most applicants are or have been under the Foundation's care. In 2023, we continued to raise awareness of the ESP Programme within the local Mongolian community to foster partnerships.

Community Service Activities

CNCF promotes the well-rounded development of our students by facilitating various community service activities. These opportunities enable young people to gain real-world experience and practice essential skills such as leadership, problem-solving, and time management, while applying their learning to practical scenarios and supporting their community.

Noble Club

From Homelessness to Hope: Nandin's* Journey with CNCF

Nandin is currently in her second year at "Ikh Zasag" University, Mongolia's top private university, where she is pursuing a degree in Law. The university is renowned for its rigorous admissions criteria and high job placement rates post-graduation.

However, Nandin's journey to success was not smooth. When she first joined CNCF's Child Sponsorship Programme in 2013 at the age of 9, she and her family were struggling. They were homeless with no stable income, relying on selling vegetables and small items like books to get by. Nandin and her sisters often spent nights sleeping on the streets.

Recognising her plight, a CNCF social worker intervened, bringing her to CNCF's Blue Skies Ger Village and enrolling her in the Child Sponsorship Programme. Through the Programme, Nandin received not only financial support but also access to various services, including enrolment in CNCF's taekwondo club where she discovered her passion for the sport. Her dedication and hard work paid off, and she achieved international success in taekwondo, earning a gold medal in a competition in Korea.

Over the years, Nandin discovered her talents and aspirations, aspiring to become a diplomat. CNCF's Education Scholarship Programme further supported her dreams by covering her tuition fees and providing opportunities for personal development, enhancing her confidence and readiness for the future workforce.

Today, Nandin lives happily with her mother, sisters, and nephews in her own ger, a traditional Mongolian home. Her journey stands as a testament to the transformative impact of CNCF's long-term and multi-faceted support and the unwavering support of her education sponsor, paving the way for a promising future ahead.

A Heartfelt Thank You

"I am delighted to share my testimonial about how my life completely changed thanks to the help and support of CNCF. I joined CNCF's Child Sponsorship Programme in 2007 when I was just 7 years old. My father died in an accident when I was only 4 years old and my mother, who was left with 2 young children, was heartbroken and did not know what to do. My mother was paid very little working as a tailor at a textile company at the time, and she could not provide proper clothing and food for us due to the very low income. Our living conditions was very difficult, it is hard to look back at this time.

Since joining the Programme, I've greatly benefited from CNCF's activities. Monthly sponsorship provided me with educational supplies and clothes, motivating me to succeed in my studies. After graduating from high school, I successfully applied for a scholarship through CNCF's Education Scholarship Programme, allowing me to study pharmacy at a private medical university. Now in my fourth year, I look forward to graduating in two more years and entering the workforce.

During my childhood, I frequently visited CNCF's office, where I received invaluable guidance from my CNCF social worker and other staff members. CNCF's Education Scholarship Programme relieved me of the financial burden of my studies and provided me with the opportunities to build confidence that I once only dreamed of.
